



Now incorporated and backed by strong inaugural board, Co. Innovation Centre is poised to unlock generational opportunities for Newfoundland and Labrador

(St. John's, NL — January 19, 2026) — Co. Innovation Centre of Newfoundland and Labrador (COIC) is solidifying the foundation needed to drive long-term economic advancement for Newfoundland and Labrador. COIC officially incorporated as an independent, not-for-profit organization effective January 1, 2026, under the Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act.

The incorporation formalizes COIC's evolution into a standalone, federally incorporated organization with a clear mandate to serve as Newfoundland and Labrador's industry-led hub for cross-sector innovation, commercialization, and economic competitiveness. Federal incorporation strengthens COIC's governance and independence while enhancing its ability to engage national and international partners, access broader funding, and support industry across sectors and jurisdictions.

"Newfoundland and Labrador is well-positioned at this moment — with deep expertise in oceans, remote operations, mining, energy and defence, as well as our strategic geographical advantages such as the gateway to the Arctic, proximity to Europe, access to critical minerals, and deep-water ports", explains the Honourable Seamus O'Regan, Chair, COIC Board of Directors. "COIC is focused on accelerating the competitiveness of Newfoundland and Labrador's industries and being an incorporated not-for-profit with a strong board helps us do that."

COIC has established a strategic Board of Directors to provide governance oversight and guide the organization through its next phase of growth as Newfoundland and Labrador's cross-sector, industry-led innovation hub. The Board reflects COIC's mandate as a cross-sector platform for collaboration and commercialization, with members bringing expertise across priority sectors including energy, oceans, mining, defence, and economic development.

"We have a clear, strong vision that is now complemented with a laser-focused board that brings the experience, credibility, and cross-sector perspective to steward COIC through its next phase—while ensuring the Centre remains non-partisan, mission-driven and focused on long-term impact for the province. It's an exciting time to be part of the innovation ecosystem in Newfoundland and Labrador."

COIC will continue to work closely with ecosystem partners and will maintain strong collaborative relationships with organizations across industry, research, and government committed to advancing innovation and commercialization in Newfoundland and Labrador.
